You have a roof, a bed and running water by contrast thousands of Black children do not these things because their mothers died this year. Help us get the word out that triple negative cancer is killing Black women. Black women need to get a mammogram, every year for the rest of their lives. How did you feel when your mother died amplified that emotion 10 times that is how a child feels when they are told they will never see their mother again. A mother's death is something that will knock you to your knees. A little girl in foster care said this at the death of her mother, "I did have a mother, but now she is gone." Another child told his mother was gone, asked why he could not go with her. Why he couldn't go to heaven and live with her.

"A young woman I mentored called me two weeks ago to tell me she had breast cancer. I had not spoken to her in 8 years. I spent a year training her in the principle of how to manage people and how to think and problem solve at her job. She called as I was writing a letter to a pastor in Atlanta, Georgia asking him to join our breast campaign. Her call reinforced my determination to see this project through. She was returning from a trip to Canada to get some herbs to treat her breast cancer. This woman has a master's degree, yet she reached out to herbs to cure her breast cancer. She was upset she did not like the treatment suggested by her doctors in Ohio. I told her to stop taking the herbs. If herbs could cure cancer those herbs would be grown under lock and key and the holders of those herbs would be billionaires if the herbs were a cure for breast cancer. We discussed the possibility of having her breast removed. I told her I would find the doctor who performed my surgery and for her to come to Michigan to get her operation at Henry Ford Hospital and to get radiation and chemotherapy. Henry Ford hospital have some great female surgeons and Henry Ford pays their surgeons well. Black women diagnosed with breast cancer, reach out for alternate cures because they lack information and confidence in their doctors, and they do not know what decisions to make regarding their diagnosis.
